House Bill 769 (s. 1006.025, F.S., Guidance Services), passed by the 2004 Florida Legislature, requires each school board to submit a district guidance report to the Commissioner of Education by June 30 of each year. The data is used to examine districts' development and implementation of guidance plans/programs, promising practices, and to identify technical assistance needs.

Our schools are required to compile a Guidance Calendar of Proposed Guidance Activities in the fall and then in the spring to resubmit these Action Plans with a Date Completed for each proposed activity.
