Title: Teacher on Special Assignment for Gifted Education (Gifted Program Facilitator)

Qualifications:

- 1. Master's degree or higher from an accredited institution preferred.
- 2. Currently hold or eligible for Florida teaching certificate in Elementary, Middle School, or Secondary School with the Gifted Endorsement.
- 3. Five years of teaching experience in Gifted Education.

Reports to: Director of Exceptional Student Education

Job Goal: To determine eligibility, ensure procedural safeguards, develop education plans (EP) and placement procedures for all gifted eligible students, and develop and monitor special programs for gifted students.

Essential Functions:

- Compiles, reviews, and interprets comprehensive evaluation data in order to determine eligibility/ineligibility for gifted program.
- Schedules eligibility/ineligibility staffings for all evaluated students, prepares staffing agenda for EP meeting, notifies all concerned persons, and verifies compliance of staffing decisions with IDEA law and district policies.
- Serves as designee of director at all EP staffing/annual review meetings.
- Assists with maintenance of a current central/automated data file of all gifted exceptional students.
- Keeps abreast of all federal, state, and school board regulations which affect gifted exceptional student education.
- Keeps abreast of all educational alternatives which may be available within the school system.
- Keeps abreast of Transportation Department procedures and assists in planning appropriate transportation for eligible gifted students at schools that require this transportation.
- Assures confidentiality of any personally identifiable data and provides Procedural Safeguard information as required.
- Provides on site, school based technical assistance or support, when requested, in areas including, but not limited to:
 - 1. Developing and writing EP's for each gifted student
 - 2. Assistance in teaching skills written in the EP
 - 3. Helping with the selection of materials to enhance the gifted curriculum
 - 4. Teaching General Education and Gifted teachers skills that they can use in their classroom's with their gifted students
- Assists in internal program reviews and evaluations, and pre-audit preparation for state monitoring.
- Assists in developing annual programs and procedures for Gifted Education.
- Coordinates and assists in initiating and developing gifted student education curricula.
- Assists in planning and conducting staff development programs.
- Functions as liaison between gifted education programs, community agencies and organizations as directed.
- Assists the director in determining program growth as established through FTE analysis, staffing patterns, and needs assessments.
- Assists in developing and implementing public relations and teacher/parent education programs.
- Prepares and submits reports as requested by the director.
- Participates in committees and meeting as requested by the director.
- Performs other duties as assigned by the Director of Exceptional Student Education.

• Provides own method of transportation to various locations when required.
