Fiscal

- The Head Start Budget was submitted to the District Finance Office and the budget was in place on March 1st for the grant period March 2014 through February 2015.
- The Program is in the process of closing out the past budget period.
- The Office of Head Start released Program Instructions on February 10, 2014 regarding the FY 2014 Funding Increase. The increased amount of funds available is for the restoration of the operational funds reduced by sequestration and for the Cost of Living Allowance (COLA). The Supplemental Grant was approved at the March 13th School Board Meeting. The grant is due to Region IV by April 25th to be thoroughly reviewed and quickly processed.
- The School Advisory Council (SAC) discussed the School Based Budgets for FY 2014-2015 school year. The council is considering purchasing some items for our Campus Beautification Project. The budget will be voted on at the next meeting.
