

**AMENDMENT TO DUAL ENROLLMENT INTER-INSTITUTIONAL ARTICULATION
AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF PENSACOLA STATE COLLEGE,
FLORIDA, AND THE SCHOOL BOARD OF SANTA ROSA COUNTY, FLORIDA**

THIS AMENDMENT is entered into by and between **THE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF PENSACOLA STATE COLLEGE, FLORIDA**, hereinafter referred to as the "College," and **THE SCHOOL BOARD OF SANTA ROSA COUNTY, FLORIDA**, hereinafter referred to as "School Board."

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the College and School Board entered into an agreement effective July 1, 2014, and they now wish to modify their agreement, now therefore,

FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual promises contained herein, the College and School Board do hereby amend their Agreement of July 1, 2014, as follows:

1. Section: Attaining and Maintaining Student Eligibility
Paragraph two (2) of this section is replaced in its entirety with the following:

Students who are proficient on state assessments (juniors and seniors must have passed all state assessments required for high school graduation), achieve appropriate placement scores on a state-approved placement examination in reading, writing, and mathematics, are in good standing with the School Board, and have attained sixth (6) through twelfth (12) grade-year status at a district school are admissible to the Dual Enrollment Program for instruction delivered on the College or high school campus. Students who fail to pass all three (3) parts of the state approved placement examination, but passed the part(s) needed to qualify for some dual enrollment courses, may enroll in dual enrollment instruction on the high school campus as approved by the appropriate School Board principal(s) or designee.

2. Section: Attaining and Maintaining Student Eligibility
Paragraph three (3) and four (4) of this section are replaced in their entirety with the following:

In addition to the placement examination requirement, a student must have earned a minimum of three (3) high school credits to be eligible for the Dual Enrollment Program. A student must have a 3.0 or higher unweighted high school GPA to qualify for college courses within the A.A or A.S., or a 2.5 or higher unweighted high school GPA to qualify for career and technical certificate Dual Enrollment courses, 1007.271(3), F.S. The student must maintain a 2.5 or higher college GPA to remain eligible for Dual Enrollment courses. A student whose college

GPA drops below 2.5 will have one (1) probationary semester to meet the college GPA requirement. A student who fails to achieve a 2.5 or higher college GPA after the probationary semester will lose all Dual Enrollment eligibility. A student must be in grade eleven (11) or twelve (12) to be eligible for online Dual Enrollment courses and must maintain a 3.0 or higher college GPA to remain eligible for enrollment in online courses. Both parties recognize that online coursework represents a unique set of challenges for students. It is recommended that a Dual Enrollment student's first experience with college-level coursework be in the traditional face-to-face classroom environment when available.

3. Section: Attaining and Maintaining Student Eligibility

Paragraph five (5) of this section is deleted in its entirety.

4. Section: Attaining and Maintaining Student Eligibility

Paragraph ten (10) of this section is replaced in its entirety with the following:

During the traditional academic year, College campus part-time dual enrollment participation may be permitted if said courses are not offered or available as dual enrollment courses on the high school campus.

The total courses that can be taken by a dual enrollment student on the high school and College campus is dependent on student grade level and college semester as indicated in the following table.

Six (6) – ten (10)	Two (2) college courses plus any accompanying labs	Two (2) college courses plus any accompanying labs	One (1) college course plus any accompanying labs
Eleven (11)	Four (4) college courses plus any accompanying labs	Four (4) college courses plus any accompanying labs	Two (2) college courses plus any accompanying labs
Twelve (12)	Five (5) college courses plus any accompanying labs	Five (5) college courses plus any accompanying labs	Two (2) college courses plus any accompanying labs

The total number of college credit hours shall not exceed eighteen (18) in any fall or spring semester or eight (8) in any summer semester.

Except as expressly amended by this instrument, the College and School Board do hereby ratify and confirm the terms and provisions of their Agreement effective July 1, 2014.
