- 2. Students will be able to determine relationships of objects and understand position concepts, as measured by improved assessment data.
- 3. Student will join adults in exploring songs, poems, and finger plays, as measured by improved assessment data.

Language and Literacy Expected Outcome: Students will demonstrate receptive and expressive language and literacy skills that will help them attain and sustain learning for school success. Student data will indicate a fifty percent increase in the domain of language and literacy at the end of each observational period.

Language and Literacy Readiness Goals:

- 1. Students will be able to use and understand language appropriately, as measured by improved assessment data.
- 2. Students will demonstrate literacy skills, as measured by improved assessment data.

Physical Expected Outcome: Students will demonstrate growth in the area of physical development and health that will help them attain and sustain learning for school success. Student data will indicate a fifty percent increase in the domain of physical development at the end of each observational period.

Physical Readiness Goal:

- 1. Students will understand and follow directions, as measured by improved assessment data.
- 2. Students will demonstrate gross motor and fine motor development skills, as measured by improved assessment data.
- 3. Students will demonstrate self-help skills.

Social Emotional Expected Outcome: Students will develop social skills to establish positive relationships with peers and adults that will help them attain and sustain learning for school success. Student data will indicate a fifty percent increase in the domain of social and emotional development at the end of each observational period.

Social Emotional Readiness Goal:

- 1. Students will be able to regulate their emotions and behaviors and form positive relationships with peers and adults, as measured by improved assessment data.
- 2. Students will be able to use their words to express their feelings and show empathy toward adults and peers, as measured by improved assessment data.
