- A CPR/AED/FIRST AID Certification Workshop was held on, October 17, 2016. We had 27 of our Head Start/Early Head Start staff renew their certification. We now have a total of 49 Head Start/Early Head Start staff members certified in CPR/AED/FIRST AID.
