RE: 2012-2013 Salaries of School Board Members

The requirements and methodology for the annual calculation of school board member salaries are set forth in sections 145.19 and 1001.395, F.S. Attached to this email is a chart showing the school board member salary amounts calculated in accordance with the statutory formula.

Please note that the provision in s. 1001.395(3), F.S. that limited the school board member salary to the lesser of the amount calculated pursuant to the statutory formula and the district's beginning salary for a teacher who holds a baccalaureate degree has expired. Also, s. 1001.395(2), F.S. authorizes school board members to reduce their statutorily calculated salary on a voluntary basis. As a result of these two statutory provisions, in some districts, the salary amount calculated pursuant to the statutory formula for 2012-2013 may provide a significant increase over the school board salary amount in effect for the 2011-2012 fiscal year. FSBA urges school board members to exercise caution in determining whether or not to accept any significant salary increase this year.

In addition, please be advised that, in accordance with Attorney General Opinion 1979-87, the 2012-2013 salary amount is effective as of July 1, 2012.

1001.395 District school board members; compensation.—

(1) Each member of the district school board shall receive a base salary, the amounts indicated in this section, based on the population of the county the district school board member serves. In addition, compensation shall be made for population increments over the minimum for each population group, which shall be determined by multiplying the population in excess of the minimum for the group times the group rate. The product of such calculation shall be added to the base salary to determine the adjusted base salary. The adjusted base salaries of district school board members shall be increased annually as provided for in s. [145.19](#).

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section or s. [145.19](#), district school board members may reduce their salary rate on a voluntary basis.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section and s. [145.19](#), for the 2010-2011 fiscal year, the salary of each district school board member shall be the amount calculated pursuant to subsection (1) or the district's beginning salary for teachers who hold baccalaureate degrees, whichever is less.
