PROGRAM DESIGN AND MANAGEMENT (PDM)

On September 9, the program received a letter from Dr. Bernadine Futrell, the Director of the Office of Head Start. She shared an important announcement from the Biden administration introducing a new requirement for Head Start programs. All Head Start employees must be vaccinated against COVID-19 by January 2022. We have sought more guidance from Sherice Horton, our Region IV Program Specialist in this matter; however, she has not provided any additional information at this time.

The 2021-2022 Policy Council/School Advisory Council had its first meeting on September 10th. Brittani Pate was elected as the Council Chair. At the meeting, the council discussed the approval of the 2021-22 School Improvement Plan and received reports from each Service Area Specialist.

Fiscal

- The Head Start/Early Head Start Program was notified in a Notice of Award on 8/13/2021 that the Early Head Start program's locally-designed option was approved and waived for the requirement 45 C.F.R. 1302.21 ©(1)(i) to provide a minimum of 1,380 annual hours of planned class operations per year for center-based services. A waiver of this requirement is approved for 40 EHS students through February 28, 2025.
- The Head Start/Early Head Start Carryover Request Application was re-submitted via Head Start Enterprise Systems (HSES) on 8/20/2021. The unobligated carryover amount had to be edited per Office of Head Start (OHS) from \$146,174.00 to \$108,056.00. These funds are being requested to be used for Head Start/Early Head Start supplies & staff trainings. We are still waiting on approval and Notice of Award of the Carryover Request.
- The Head Start/Early Head Start Program received the Annual Funding Guidance Letter on 8/24/2021 from OHS for the application for funding for the upcoming budget period 3/1/2022 2/28/2023. The application must be prepared in accordance with the Head Start Grant Application Instructions with Guidance Version 3 and submitted by December 1, 2021 into HSES. The Continuation Grant will be for the total funding amount of \$2,858,717. This amount is for Head Start/Early Head Start Program Operations and Training/Technical Assistance which reflects the enrollment of 220 Head Start students and 40 Early Head Start students.
- The Head Start/Early Head Start Program received the Notice of Award on 9/8/2021 for the Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) supplemental grant funds. The COLA will help support FY 2021-2022 funding levels to increase staff salaries, fringe benefits, and offset higher operating costs. The Head Start program amount is \$24,440.00 and the Early Head Start program amount is \$9,572.00 for total funding of \$34,012.00. The COLA supplement budget period is from 3/1/2021 2/28/2022.
- The following six (6) schools in Santa Rosa County receive Head Start (HS)/Early Head Start (EHS) funds for Pre-K:
 - 1. Bagdad Elementary School (HS)
 - 2. Central School (HS)
 - 3. East Milton Elementary School (HS)
 - 4. Jay Elementary School (HS)
 - 5. T.R. Jackson Pre-K Center (EHS & HS)
 - 6. West Navarre Primary School (HS)

Education

- In September, teachers began their 2021-22 Galileo data input for School Readiness Goals. The data allows teachers to plan and implement developmentally appropriate and ready to learn skills for the students.
- Plans for October's Pumpkin Patch and Storybook Character parade were discussed. The Special Events Team members are finalizing the activities these events.
- Heggerty Phonological and Phonemic Awareness training for Head Start staff of 3 and 4 year old students was held on September 21st with Marjorie Bottari as the literacy specialist presenter. This training was very beneficial to the staff.
- Both the Education Specialist and Curriculum Coach attended the Child Plus online training from Sept 27th to Sept 29th.

Environmental Health and Safety/Nutrition & Dental

Health and Safety

- All 6 Head Start Centers are in compliance with their School-Site Safety Reporting.
- Three **fire drills** were conducted during August and September. We conducted 2 fire drills in August. The first fire drill was conducted on August 13th and the 2nd fire drill on August 20th. In September, we conducted our 3rd fire drill on September 24th.
- The annual **Hood and Fire Extinguisher inspection** was on August 19th.
- The **Comprehensive Safety Inspection** was on Tuesday, August 17th. We are now working on correcting any deficiencies found during the inspection. Workorders were submitted for deficiencies we could not correct "in-house."
- The monthly Threat Assessment Team meeting was on Thursday, September 9th.
- **Flu Shots** and other vaccinations were offered to the staff on Monday, September 13th. We had approximately 25 staff and family members participate.
- **Vision and Hearing Screenings** were conducted on all Early Head Start and Head Start students from Monday, September 13th to Friday, September 24th.
- We have a CPR/AED/FIRST AID Certification class scheduled for Thursday, October 7th.

PARENT FAMILY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT (PFCE) / MENTAL HEALTH / DISABILITIES

The Parent, Family and Community Engagement (PFCE) Service Area has a variety of responsibilities in the Head Start and Early Head Start Programs. This year in addition to family assignments, each family advocate has been assigned to a specific area of the program: Family Partnerships, Community Partnerships, and Male Engagement. This delegation of responsibility is already showing growth in our ability to serve families more effectively.

- We provided 8 children with shoes donated by various individuals and organizations.
- Twelve families received food bags provided by Food Raising Friends.
- Over 95% of our families participated in conferences with their assigned family advocate to complete a survey based on the Head Start PFCE Outcomes Framework which helps identify family strengths and needs. Families are also encouraged to write measurable and attainable goals that we will assist them with throughout the school year.
- We encouraged families to participate in Dads Take Your Child to School with an emphasis on male engagement, called Dad Rocks. Children painted rocks with their dad or other male figure in their life and returned them to school to become part of our WE ROCK rock garden. We took pictures of 94 children with their families and have 148 rocks in our garden. (see photo below)

Guidance/Social and Emotional Health and Disabilities

- The guidance department is focusing on helping students manage emotions/feelings. Small group and whole group lessons will be tailored towards helping students become aware of their emotions and, ways to successfully manage emotions when they need to.
- Resources were provided to some parents on developing a routine and schedule and helping with transitions.
- Weekly Self-Care information is distributed to teachers and staff as a reminder of the importance of self-care especially during these tough times.
- "Caught ya" Capturing kids Hearts email has gone out.
- Parent training on the 7 Powers for Conscious Adults is currently in the works and expected to start soon.
- School Counselors have been very active in classrooms and around the school helping students transition to school.
- Counselors are a part of weekly MTSS meetings.
