I just wanted to make you aware that we had to pull and use our AED this afternoon. A subcontractor working on the construction of our new cafeteria was on a tall ladder. He grabbed a live wire and fell from the ladder. He was unconscious and not breathing. Our emergency team (AED/CPR) responded immediately and an ambulance was called simultaneously. The man appeared to be breathing again due to the quick action of Kim Perritt, one of our bus drivers, and Christy Vincent, Clinic Tech, who were the first responders followed quickly by our crisis response team.

I want to make sure I give a huge WOW! to Christy and Kim for being first responders and acting so quickly and appropriately.

***We are now in need of adult AED pads as we used ours today.

Man electrocuted at S.S. Dixon Intermediate

Thursday afternoon, around 2:20, Pace Firefighters and Lifeguard Ambulance personnel were dispatched to S.S. Dixon Intermediate following reports of an electrocution at the construction area, near the bus ramp.

Radio transmissions reveal a 44-year-old man was hit with 277 volts of electricity and fell from a ladder, approximately 10 feet. The school nurse was doing CPR while EMS and fire rescue responded.

The victim was transported to Sacred Heart Hospital, emergency status. He has a heartbeat at this time this article was posted. EMS reported to dispatchers the man has a broken ankle - unknown if there are other injuries.
