PARENT, FAMILY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT (PFCE)

- We held a Kindergarten Transition training for parents of students in our four year old program. The training was led by our director, Dawn Alt, and Santa Rosa's Teacher of the Year, Kristen White. The purpose of the training was to help parents understand what they must do to register their child for kindergarten, what to expect in kindergarten, and how to help prepare their child for kindergarten. At the conclusion of the training, each family received a transition backpack that included a summer calendar of daily activities, a journal to document each activity, and supplies they would need to complete each activity.
- Last month we reported that one of our family advocates transferred to another job in the district. That position has been filled by one of our current Early Head Start teachers, Doris Luther. Her experience as a teacher and with our advocates as a teacher has laid a great foundation for this new responsibility. She and April Thurman will be working toward meeting the new Head Start Performance Standard requirement that family service workers in the program earn, at a minimum, a family services credential within eighteen months of employment.
