

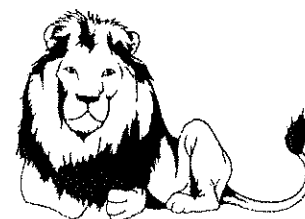

Theresa Gail May Scholarship Foundation

One \$4,000 scholarship per student, awarded by the Milton campus director, 484-4436. Graduates of Central, Gulf Breeze, Jay, Locklin Vocational, Milton, Navarre, Pace and Santa Rosa Adult high schools should demonstrate a need for supplemental funding, have a minimum 2.5 grade point average and live in Santa Rosa County. He or she should possess leadership qualities as demonstrated in high school or in the community and be enrolled full-time or part-time. Funds cover tuition, fees and/or books.
