Good morning,

Section 1003.631, Florida Statutes, requires the State Board of Education to designate a school as a School of Excellence if the school's percentage of possible points earned in its school grade calculation is in the 80th percentile or higher for schools comprised of the same grade groupings (elementary, middle, high and combination) for at least two of the last three school years.

In order to qualify for initial designation as a School of Excellence, schools had to receive a grade of A or B in each of the most recent three school years (2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18) and had to rank at the 80th percentile or higher for their school type for at least two of the last three years. Qualifying schools shall retain the designation for up to three years. There are 52 elementary, 11 middle, 10 high and 15 combination schools that qualified as Schools of Excellence for the first time in 2017-18. Schools that received an initial School of Excellence designation based on 2016-17 school grades maintained that designation if the school earned a 2017-18 school grade of A or B. There are 333 elementary, 116 middle, 94 high and 87 combination schools that maintained the designation.
