"Bigs Inspiring Scholastic Success" will target male and female participants K-8th grade, assistance in improving academic achievement in one or more core areas. One-to-one services will be provided to the youth and delivered at school locations. Some anticipated will be eighty-five percent (85%) of mentored students will maintain or improve academ eighty-five percent (85%) of mentored students will maintain or improve school attendar percent (80%) of students will show improvement on behavior evaluation and eighty percof mentored students will be promoted to the next grade level.

Partner Responsibilities:

- 3. Complete service delivery components orientation, intake, assessment, match training, support, activities and evaluation.
- 4. Provide level 2 screening w/fingerprinting of all mentors in accordance with San County School Board policy.
- 5. Support the relationship throughout the length of the match.
- 6. Recruit school volunteer mentors from the county to match with enrolled student the district.
- 7. Conduct assessments of youth and families.
- 8. Maintain a log of volunteer activities associated with this project and submit to appropriate offices.
- 9. Be responsible for funding all supplies, training, marketing and any other expensions support of the program.
